E22. Artworks

E22.1. Background

Artworks provide an opportunity to create a sense of place, and can play a valuable role in enlivening people's experiences and the appearance of the physical environment. Artworks can be located on public space or on private property.

Artworks are encouraged, however potential effects from the location, installation or impacts from lighting and noise, particularly in open space areas, may need to be managed to avoid adverse effects on public access, navigation, public safety and amenity values.

The rules for art works are located in the relevant zone provisions.

E22.2. Objective [rcp/dp]

(1) Inspiring, thought-provoking, culturally vibrant, enjoyable and challenging artworks are installed in appropriate locations across Auckland.

E22.3. Policies [rcp/dp]

- (1) Enable temporary artworks.
- (2) Encourage new development to incorporate artworks.
- (3) Provide for the installation of artworks that will support and enhance use and enjoyment of open space.
- (4) Reinforce and extend the role of artworks in creating landmarks and a sense of place in Auckland.
- (5) Enable the expression of Māori culture and values through artworks.
- (6) Control the scale, location and design of artworks to maintain the amenity values of the site and adjoining sites.
- (7) Support the use of high-quality, long-lasting materials (where appropriate for the artwork), and design and execute artworks to a high standard.
- (8) Avoid significant adverse effects such as noise, lighting, traffic and visual effects on the surrounding area from artworks.
